Shielding advice is currently in place in tier 4 areas, and so all children still deemed clinically extremely vulnerable are advised not to attend school.</p> <p>From 20th December Hertfordshire is in tier 4 Those staff who are clinically extremely vulnerable are to work from home and not to come into work. 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		<p>Staff Wider government advice remains to work from home where possible. Limited school roles where this will be the case, roles which are able to do so effectively will be considered.</p> <p>Individuals classed as clinically vulnerable or extremely clinically vulnerable to have a risk assessment undertaken on their role and ability to maintain social distancing. <p>School occupants coming into contact with those with Coronavirus symptoms</p>	<p>Staff, Students / pupils / wider contacts</p> <p>Spread of COVID 19</p>	<p>School community clear on symptoms of coronavirus: high temperature (37.8 degree C or more), a new continuous cough or a loss of, or change, in their normal sense of taste or smell. Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection followed.</p> <p>No symptomatic individuals to present on site.</p> <p>In the event of a suspected case whilst working on site Ensure Head / SLT are notified.</p> <p>Go home immediately (if awaiting collection by their parent, isolate child in medical room, an area at least 2m away from others, open a window for ventilation) and self-isolate.</p> <p>School staff supervising the child while they await collection should wear PPE (a fluid resistant surgical mask) if a distance of 2m cannot be maintained. This should take place in the medical room.</p> <p>If direct care (such as for a very young child or a child with complex needs) is required then staff giving care to wear a fluid resistant surgical mask, disposable apron and gloves. 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		<p>have any tissues available, they should cough and sneeze into the crook of their elbow.</p> <p>If they need to go to the bathroom whilst waiting for medical assistance, they should use the accessible toilet by the main school office.</p> <p>The room and toilet will need to be cleaned once they have left.</p> <p>Anyone who has had contact with those with symptoms to wash hands thoroughly.</p> <p>Clear message to parents that if a student is unwell at school they will be sent home and need to be collected immediately.</p> <p>Areas occupied and equipment used by the affected person are to be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected. Testing is most sensitive within 3 days of symptoms developing. Guidelines on who can get tested and how to arrange for a test can be found in the COVID-19: getting tested guidance.</p> <p>Tests can be booked online through the NHS https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/</p> <p>By the autumn term, all schools will be provided with a small number of home testing kits which can be provided to parents/carers collecting a child who has developed symptoms at school, or staff who have developed symptoms at school, where providing one will significantly increase the likelihood of them getting tested.</p> <p>Positive case in school In the event of a positive case report to HCC via X</p>

<p>General Transmission of COVID-19</p> <p>Ineffective hygiene protocols</p>	<p>Staff, Students / pupils / wider contacts</p> <p>Spread of COVID 19</p>	<p>Welfare facilities are provided which contain suitable levels of soap and paper towels. All persons to wash hands with soap regularly and thoroughly, for at least 20 seconds. Hand washing technique to be adopted as directed by NHS guidance posters in place to reinforce this.</p> <p>Alcohol hand sanitiser provided at main office, toilets and classrooms and should be used by all persons when entering/leaving if soap can not be used.</p> <p>Site staff to regularly clean the hand washing facilities and check consumables. 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<p>Effective hygiene protocols</p>		<p>Continue to use social distancing wherever possible (more emphasis on this is likely with older children).</p> <p>Where staff move across groups hands to be washed / sanitised before and after and social distancing should be maintained, aim for 2m from other staff and adults as far as is reasonable. Staff asked to wear visors when working with children that aren't from their usual class.</p> <p>Ideally the teaching space should be 2m from pupils, where this is within 1m then change layout / increase space at the front of the class to attain 1m+.</p> <p>Staff to avoid close face to face contact and minimise time spent within 1 metre of anyone.</p> <p>Where possible, staff to avoid face to face contact and minimise time spent within 1 metre of anyone. This will not always be possible with younger children or when supporting children with complex and special educational needs.</p> <p>Depending on the age and needs of the children, they will reminded maintain a distance and not touch staff or peers where possible.</p> <p>Children to sit side by side and face the front in classrooms where possible.</p> <p>No assemblies or school events to take place.</p> <p>Remind children how to wash hands.</p> <p>Children handwash or alcohol hand sanitiser on entry to school, before break, after break, before lunch, after lunch, leaving school, using the toilet and any time they cough or sneeze.</p> <p>Children permitted to bring in name-labelled hand cream.</p> <p>Teacher to ensure only one boy and one girl allowed to go to toilet at a time from their class.</p> <p>Extra signs in toilet re washing hands. 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		<p>Extra soap ordered to ensure we do not run out. Weekly monitoring of soap, alcohol hand sanitiser and paper towels to take place.</p> <p>Soap, alcohol hand sanitiser and paper towels to be topped up at the end of each day.</p> <p>Toilet bins and classroom bins emptied at lunchtime – to be completed by Paul Ryan.</p> <p>PPE available for staff members dealing with any child that has soiled themselves and for first aid if dealing with bodily fluids.</p> <p>Alcohol hand sanitiser provided at school entrance/exit and should be used by all staff when entering/leaving.</p> <p>All persons to wash hands with soap regularly and thoroughly, for at least 20 seconds.</p> <p>Tissues will be provided for classrooms. Staff to replenish as needed. (Authorised by HT).</p> <p>Office staff to remain behind the glass.</p> <p>Ensure all visitors / building users are aware of expectations. They must follow social distancing, hand washing / use of sanitiser on entry and adhere to any restrictions on accessing parts of the building stipulated by the school. Signage in reception regarding good hygiene. Visitors will be asked to wear a face covering.</p> <p>Specialists, therapists and other support staff for pupils with SEND will be able to complete interventions as usual. (Still authorised by HT)</p> <p>Our signing in sheet will be our record of visitors.</p>				

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		<p>Staff On arrival all staff are also required to wash hands using nearest available toilet or use the sanitiser provided in reception / staff room.</p>				
<p>Contact points Equipment use printers, workstations, apparatus, machinery etc. Teaching provision</p>	<p>Staff, Students / pupils / wider contacts</p> <p>Spread of COVID 19</p>	<p>Parents to ensure children have their own water bottles in school to reduce contact with water fountains. Water fountains not to be used. Regularly clean and disinfect common contact surfaces in the office, access control etc. (screens, telephone handsets, desks).</p> <p>Children asked to bring in own basic stationery and this stationery must remain in school for the duration of the week. This stationery must not be shared with other children.</p> <p>Classroom based resources, such as books and games, can be used and shared within the class; these should be cleaned regularly, along with all frequently touched surfaces.</p> <p>Resources that are shared between classes, such as sports, art and science equipment should be cleaned frequently and meticulously and always between classes, or rotated to allow them to be left unused and out of reach for a period of 48 hours (72 hours for plastics) between use by different classes.</p> <p>Only essential items to be brought into school.</p> <p>Pupils and teachers can take books and other shared resources home, although unnecessary sharing should be avoided.</p> <p>Tables, door handles and other surfaces cleaned every night and throughout the day – completed by Paul Ryan.</p> <p>School reading books can be sent home. They must then be left for 48 hours before being touched again.</p> <p>Resources on tables ready for lesson and not distributed within the lesson.</p> <p>Trays/baskets to be used for shared resources.</p> <p>Staff to ensure iPads and laptops wiped down with anti-bac down after use.</p> <p>Mr Moran will continue to deliver PE lessons on Wednesdays and Fridays outside or in the hall if wet. He will adhere to staff protocols. Mr Moran will continue to take out a walkie talkie and call for assistance should any first aid be necessary. Where possible the class teacher assistant will go out and</p>				

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		<p>support with first aid and cleaning. Mr Moran to avoid sharing equipment. When this does happen, cleaning will need to take place.</p> <p>Music lessons to be taught by Mrs Luchies. Any shared instruments between classes must be cleaned. Children will not be permitted to sing in lessons. This will not take place during the January 2021 lockdown.</p> <p>Mrs Black will teach violin lessons to the named children each week. She will follow our whole school risk assessment and visitor protocols. Any shared instruments/stands will be cleaned between classes. This will not take place during the January 2021 lockdown.</p> <p>Music-dance and drama Social distancing to be observed. This may limit group numbers. Keep background / accompanying music to levels which do not encourage teachers or other performers to raise their voices unduly. If possible use microphones, avoid sharing these. Clean equipment before / after use and between users / groups.</p>	<p>Christmas performances to be virtual / recorded for parents, no audiences in order to minimise risks. All undertaken in same consistent school bubbles.</p>

Children will only use their locker at the start and end of the day. Teachers to reorganise locker layouts according to first name.</p> <p>Children to wear school uniform. However, if parents feel that this is necessary, their child must be competent in its use and must not compromise their own safety or that of others through its use. Where social distancing is not possible in areas outside of the classroom between members of staff or visitors, they may be asked to wear face coverings in these circumstances.</p> <p>Our curriculum remains broad and ambitious: all pupils continue to be taught a wide range of subjects, maintaining their choices for further study and employment.</p>	<p>Communication to parents</p>			

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		<p>Government's aim is to return to the school's normal curriculum in all subjects by summer term 2021: Substantial modification to the curriculum may be needed at the start of the year, so teaching time should be prioritised to address significant gaps in pupils' knowledge with the aim of returning to the school's normal curriculum content by no later than summer term 2021. We will be aiming to do this sooner than this date.</p> <p>We plan on the basis of the educational needs of pupils: Curriculum planning should be informed by an assessment of pupils' starting points and addressing the gaps in their knowledge and skills, in particular making effective use of regular formative assessment.</p> <p>Staff Staff social distancing to take place</p> <p>Staff meeting to discuss concerns and shared control measures.</p> <p>Sharing of support helplines – HCC and others.</p> <p>HT on site every day for staff to share concerns with.</p> <p>Staff permitted to wear visors.</p> <p>Risk assessments reviewed after day one, week one and fortnightly after that – this is flexible.</p> <p>Library used as staff room to allow social distancing.</p> <p>Avoid main office area whenever possible – if needed, use internal window.</p> <p>Internal phones to be used as means of communication.</p> <p>Photocopier / medical room to be used by one member of staff at a time. 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		<p>Some resources (including reading books) will be rotated and left to de-contaminate for 48 hours (72 hours plastics) after cleaning to reduce the risk of indirect transmission if shared with other classes.</p> <p>Deep cleaning of classrooms before September.</p> <p>Weekly sanitisation of the classrooms and communal areas using an electrostatic sprayer. Teachers to ensure classroom worktops are clear.</p> <p>Cleaning protocol is as follows:</p> <p>For a deep clean / disinfection (e.g. following a suspected case) use a combined detergent disinfectant solution at a dilution of 1000 parts per million (ppm) available chlorine (av.cl.) or a neutral purpose detergent followed by disinfection (1000 ppm av.cl.).</p> <p>See PHE advice the COVID-19: cleaning of non-healthcare settings guidance</p> <p>Manufacturer's instructions for dilution, application, PPE and contact times for all detergents and disinfectants to be followed.</p> <p>When cleaning a contaminated area Cleaning staff to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wear disposable gloves and apron • Wash their hands with soap and water once they remove their gloves and apron • Fluid resistant surgical mask if splashing likely • Hands should be washed with soap and water for 20 seconds after all PPE has been removed. <p>PPE to be double-bagged, and placed in the yellow bin in the hall.</p> <p>Any cloths and mop heads used must be disposed of as single use items.</p> <p>Hand towels and hand wash are to be checked and replaced as needed by site / cleaning staff.</p> <p>Enhance the cleaning regimes for toilet facilities, particularly door handles, locks and the toilet flush, etc.</p>

Lack of awareness of PHE / school controls	Staff, Students / pupils / wider contacts	<p>Posters will be displayed in the reception, around the school and in suitable places around site.</p> <p>Clear briefing for all personnel on site, warning them of the risks posed by the virus as well as the control measures outlined in this assessment and from government guidance.</p> <p>Peripatetic, temporary / supply staff, sports coaches and other providers are briefed on school's arrangements for managing and minimising risk, including need to maintain distance (2m where possible) from other staff and pupils.</p>
