WHAT IT MADE ME THINK...

- I wish I had all this help and guidance 30 years ago as a single parent with a boy and a girl
- It's okay to talk to my children
- What I need to do
- The importance of conveying the correct information
- Very good

- The session made me feel confident in the school

WHAT I WILL THROW AWAY...

- Worries
- Worry that my children won't learn the correct information
- I will no longer worry that RSE will not be age appropriate. I now understand it is!
- I'm actually more worried now than before that children in Y5 and Y6 will learn too much too soon
- Worry that he's not ready
- I'm no longer worried about the content of RSE
- Embarrassment
- I'm not concerned that it is too much information
- Not over worry
- Thoughts about how lessons work
- Worries of where to start

WHAT IT WILL MAKE ME DO....

- Little talk time to time rather than some big talk
- Talk openly to my child
- Be more confident the way I explain things
- Talk to children
- Start discussions and conversation
- I'm going to be more open with the children
- I will hope to continue talking to my children about the stages of growing up. I am going to fill in the govt consultation
- Talk more
- Be more open
- I'm going to watch carefully what is being taught and when
- I will work with the school to ensure I am open with my son about questions on RSE
- I'm going to talk more
- Proactive talking
- Talk to my children more about SRE in bits and regularly
