### Farewell and welcome!

This term, we bid a heartfelt farewell and thank you to Mrs Schofield as she moves onto a new role out of County. She has truly loved working with the children and seeing them grow in the 6 years that she has worked in the school. We've already been working closely with her replacement, Miss Brassington, and look forward to welcoming her officially in January. We also say farewell to Miss McTait this term. This has been a heart-wrenching decision to make as Miss McTait has loved working here, however, she has been offered a full-time position elsewhere.

### **Attendance and Lateness**

Our school target for attendance is set by the Local Authority at 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 96.2%. Attendance figure includes unauthorised absences, absences related to illness, medical appointments, and lateness. We must all work together to ensure children are in school providing they are well enough. Please find current RAG (red, amber and green) rated class attendance below.

#### Free School Meals

This term, our Pupil Premium strategy has supported the buying of a new English scheme that is in place across school, with some beautiful new texts being used and supporting our writing; cello nurture lessons, which has encouraged a few children to want to ask about lessons to continue their skills; and supported some children in accessing school trips.
