Update from the Governing Body

As the school's admitting authority, we have ranked Reception 2025 applications. We've also focused on the school's planned curriculum, reviewing the adjustments and changes that staff have implemented to enhance learning. Governors were pleased to attend the recent reading session and Number Day, engaging with both children and parents to support our school community. We've also worked closely with senior leaders to plan the exciting celebrations for the school's 60th anniversary. We look forward to continuing our work to ensure the best outcomes for all children.

Attendance and Lateness

Our school target for attendance is set by the Local Authority at 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 96.3%. Attendance figure includes unauthorised absences, absences related to illness, medical appointments, and lateness. Arriving late for pick-up affects staff, as they need to stay with the children when they should be in meetings or training. Lastly, after-school clubs end at 4:30pm—please be mindful of staff time and collect your child on time. Thank you for your cooperation!
