Academies Update

We continue to make positive progress in our journey to join the Diocese of Westminster Academy Trust (DOWAT). We are currently completing Stage 1 of the due-diligence process and have submitted our application to the Department for Education to begin the formal conversion. Our stakeholder consultation, an important opportunity for parents, staff, and the wider community to share their views, will take place in the spring. We will keep you updated as we move through each stage.





Roles and Responsibilities

This term, our Eco-Committee members took the lead in organising a successful 'Switch Off Fortnight', encouraging the whole school to be more energy conscious. Additionally, two of our Year 6 pupils proudly represented the school at a Stevenage Parliament Meeting held at the Council Chambers, where they spoke on behalf of their peers. Please remember the following guidelines, which aim to keep our school a safe place to be:


- Only park in designated spaces in the car park not along the hedge, yellow zig zag lines, in the open space near the entrance or in front of the school gates.


